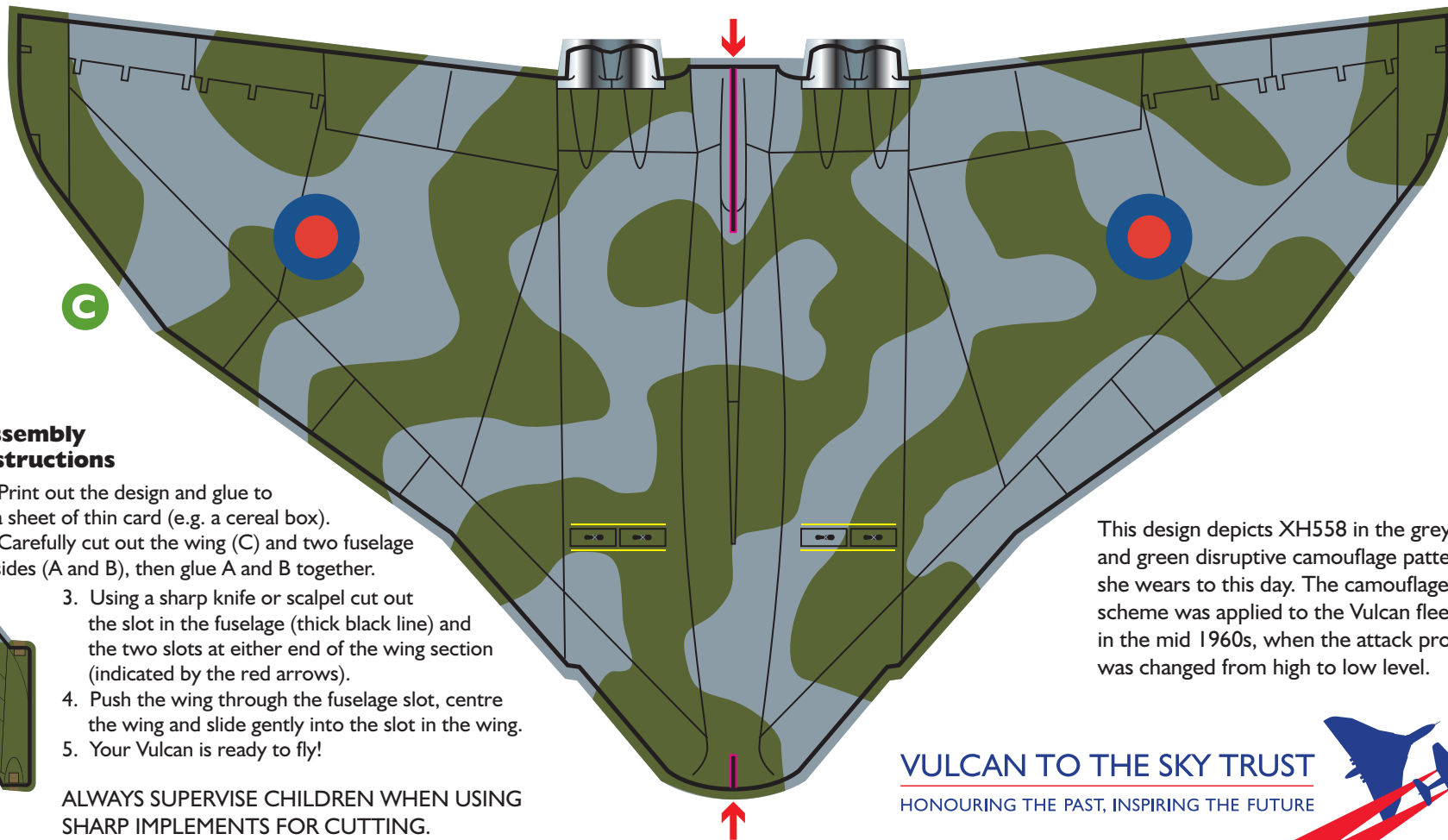
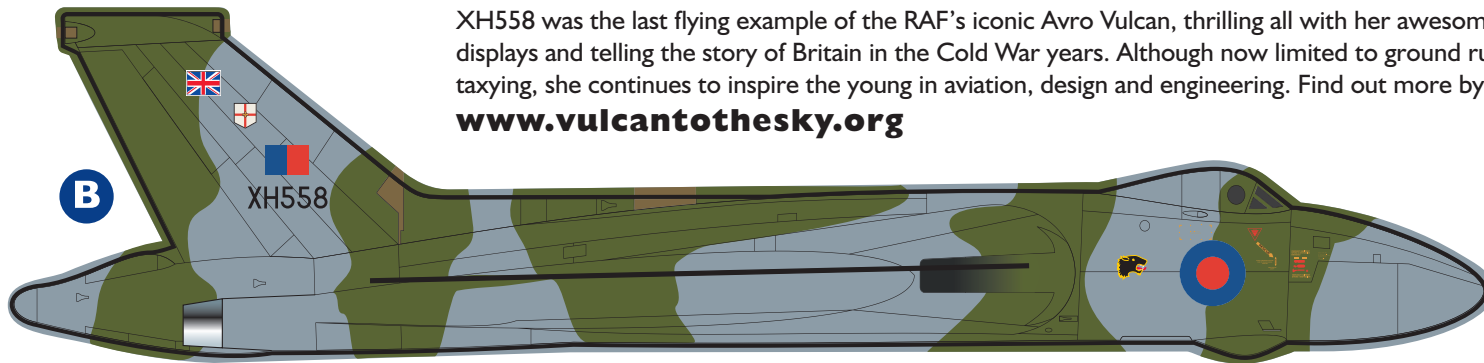
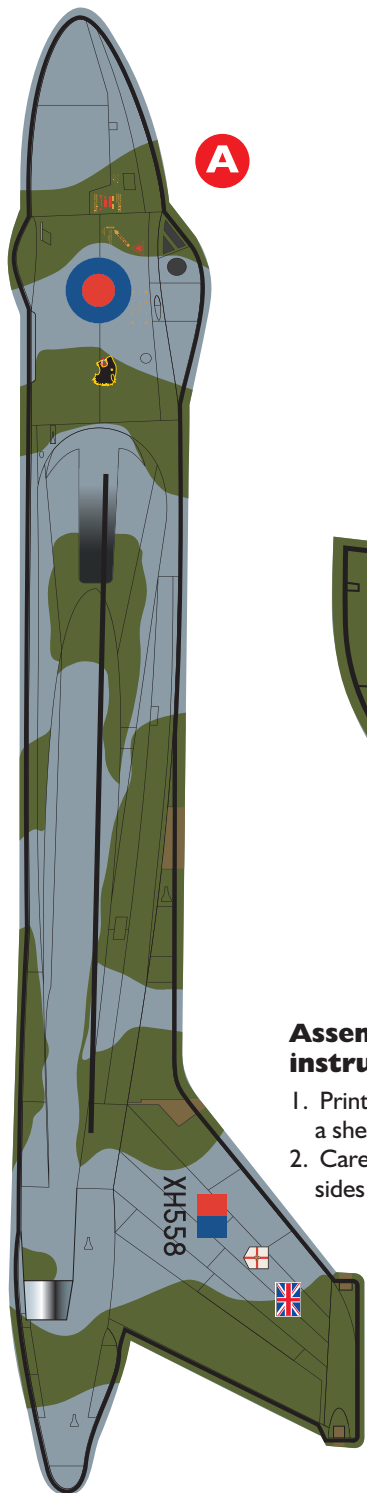


Avro Vulcan XH558

XH558 was the last flying example of the RAF's iconic Avro Vulcan, thrilling all with her awesome displays and telling the story of Britain in the Cold War years. Assembly instructions

1. Print out the design and glue to a sheet of thin card (e.g. a cereal box).
2. Carefully cut out the wing (C) and two fuselage sides (A and B), then glue A and B together.
3. Using a sharp knife or scalpel cut out the slot in the fuselage (thick black line) and the two slots at either end of the wing section (indicated by the red arrows).
4. Push the wing through the fuselage slot, centre the wing and slide gently into the slot in the wing.
5. Your Vulcan is ready to fly!

ALWAYS SUPERVISE CHILDREN WHEN USING SHARP IMPLEMENTS FOR CUTTING.

This design depicts XH558 in the grey and green disruptive camouflage pattern she wears to this day. The camouflage scheme was applied to the Vulcan fleet in the mid 1960s, when the attack profile was changed from high to low level.
